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Human Rights & Employment Equity

The UNDE is obligated by law to adhere to the Canadian Human Rights Act which promotes Human Rights and Employment Equity (HR/EE) for all members regardless of race, national or ethnic origin, colour, religion, age, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, marital status, family status, genetic characteristics, disability and conviction for an offence for which a pardon has been granted or in respect of which a record suspension has been ordered. If you feel you have been treated unfairly or that you may have been discriminated against based on any of the prohibited grounds above, contact your Regional Human Rights Coordinator Advisor.



The aims and objectives of the UNDE Human Rights Committee include the following:

- Provides support, guidance and advice in identifying and removing barriers by promoting a greater understanding of the Employment Equity Act and Human Right issues that affect all UNDE members.
- Assist our locals, the UNDE National Executive and the Public Service Alliance of Canada in their efforts to promote and achieve equity for all.
- Promote greater understanding of issues related to Human Rights and Employment Equity as they continue to emerge.
